
## LEAD TESTING AT THE INDOOR RANGE



As many of you know, the Lincoln Rifle Club’s (LRC) Indoor Range, located in McBean Park, was temporarily closed by the City of Lincoln on April 27<sup>th</sup>. The City entered the building along with a State Certified Lead Project Monitor to collect samples. The test results revealed that the lead levels in the shooting area and in the classroom were elevated “beyond safe”. The results for the outside area of the building tested safe.

The Club’s Board of Directors allocated funds “not to exceed \$12,500” to hire a professional firm to clean up the range to the point that it not only passes State Certification but also provides a safe and clean area of our shooters. On May 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup>, the classroom and the shooting area were cleaned. This process included all horizontal services, walls, floors, ceilings, & window sills. The proposal included all labor, material, equipment and waste disposal. On Friday, the Club engaged the original testing agency (used by the City), and had them retest the range most specifically at the locations previously tested. In addition, the LRC will be hiring an independent testing laboratory to test both the shooting and classroom environments to ensure we are compliant with all standards. The cleaning and testing efforts will be on-going until such time as our Indoor Range is declared safe. With the scheduled cleaning efforts we anticipate reaching safe levels very soon and reopening our range to indoor shooting activities. We ask that you respect the “closed” signs on this facility. As soon as we receive the “all clean”, you will receive an e-mail letting you know we are back in business.

In the future, the Junior Program will continue to exercise an established cleaning protocol and the LRC will deny entrance to the facility to any or all that do not follow such protocol. In addition, the Club will proactively initiate testing to share with the City.

## **MEET YOUR PRESIDENT—LEONARD ZICK**

Leonard Zick was born on May 22, 1947, the same year B.F. Goodrich announced the development of a tubeless tire. Also interesting is on the “day of his birth”, May 22, in the year 1972, Richard Nixon became the first US president to visit Russia. This only goes to show you that good things often come in multiple packages.

Leonard was actually born in Placer County, attended St. Joseph’s Catholic Elementary School and Placer High School. Following his HS graduation, Leonard found time to spend 1 year at Sierra College. His education was interrupted in 1967, when he accepted a job with the County of Placer, Public Works at Lake Tahoe. While pursuing a career with Placer County, Leonard completed his college his education at Sierra College in the early 1980’s by attending night classes.

Initially, Leonard was assigned to maintain the County district on the North Shore, but transferred to the Lincoln area in the late 1980’s for 10 years. After over 30 years of service, Leonard retired out of the Auburn office in 2004.

In late 1980, Leonard became a member of the Lincoln Rifle Club (LRC). He has a long record of service to our Club, including serving as a match director for most shooting disciplines supported by LRC. But, serving as a match director was not quite enough for Leonard, he is also an accomplished shooter in several shooting matches, and currently, is an active participant in the Club’s multi-gun competitions.

In addition to being an involved shooter, Leonard is currently serving as President of the LRC and Chairman of the Board of Directors. His service and dedication to the LRC, is done in addition to his membership as a board member on the forward-thinking group; the Lincoln Shooting Sports Foundation. It is safe to say that Leonard serves the shooting sports in both past and present commitments.

His personal love of the sport can be seen in his interest in reloading (since the age of 19). He has accumulated knowledge and brass by rubbing elbows with fellow shooters. He has also attended quite a number of Gunsmithing classes at Lassen College, learning the intricate operations of fire-arms, as well as, expert repair techniques.

Supporting the shooting sports is a “family affair” for the Zicks. Currently, Leonard lives on a small ranch with his lovely wife Kathy where they have a menagerie of both large and small animals. Kathy has also been instrumental in the support of LRC activities, by giving of her time and talents in providing hot meals to the multi-gun shooters during their matches, and also, providing an equally elegant lunch to the participants of the ANNIE GET YOUR GUN events. The LRC is indebted to both Leonard and Kathy for their efforts to promote safe and enjoyable shooting to both the public and LRC membership.



It would be safe to say LEONARD LOVES THE SHOOTING SPORTS and is willing to commit his time and efforts to their continued existence. If you see Leonard, take a moment and tell him; “THANKS”, to all he has given and continues to give so we can enjoy our 2nd Amendment rights.
