## LINCOLN RIFLE CLUB “BRASS POLICY”



Recently there have been questions regarding the Club’s “brass policy.” At the last general meeting, held on Thursday, July 7th, the Chief Range Safety Officer (RSO), Phil Pennington, explained that while shooting at the Dillman Range, members and public shooters are enti-



tled to retrieve their own brass and take it home. Also, members and public shooters may collect brass from another shooter, as long as the shooter has given them permission to do so. Members and public shooters **ARE NOT ALLOWED TO COLLECT UNCLAIMED BRASS**. Unclaimed brass becomes the property of the Lincoln Rifle Club and is recycled for cash, which is deposited in the LRC’s general fund. If a member wants to sort through the Range’s “brass bucket” and select brass, the RSO on duty can weigh it and price it for sale. ## RECOMMENDATION REGARDING PAID EMPLOYEES AS BOARD MEMBERS

## **LEGISLATIVE CORNER**

### **Being a Gun Owner in California Just More Complicated**

Gov. Jerry Brown signed six gun bills on July 1. Measures on ammunition checks, gun lending, and high-capacity magazines will be in effect soon. Here are answers to some of the more common questions and concerns that arose in interviews with gun owners.

**Q:** While travelling, can I bring ammo I purchased in another state back into California?

**A:** You can bring at most 50 rounds back in to the state. Any more than that and you could be hit with a misdemeanor. There is no plan to set up new checkpoints to check whether people are bringing ammunition, but people could face questions about ammo at the agricultural stops. If you purchase ammunition in California, go to another state, and then return with more than 50 rounds, keep a record of the sale to establish it's on the level.

**Q:** I own a gun with a detachable magazine. Am I breaking the law?

**A:** Two bills, Senate Bill 880 and Assembly Bill 1135, sought to close what law enforcement groups and gun control advocates call the “bullet-button” loophole. California law already prohibits assault weapons, defined as those with magazines that can be detached without disassembling the gun or using a tool.

Beginning in 2017, the new laws will ban the sale of semi-automatic, centerfire rifles, or semi-automatic pistols that do not have a fixed magazine and also have one from a list of specific design features (not listed here.) See YouTube; <https://youtu.be/XedaFH6pC1o> by the inventor of the Bullet Button for his new “Bullet Button Reloaded” to resolve issues with the 2017 law.

**Q:** If I have an old gun that fits that definition, do I have to get rid of it?

**A:** Not if you bought it between 2001 and 2016. But you will need to register it with the California Department of Justice by the start of 2018. You can find a form online at <https://oag.ca.gov/firearms/forms>, and it should cost at most \$20.

**Q:** My dad owns a semiautomatic with a detachable magazine that fits the new definition of an assault weapon. Will I be able to inherit it when he dies or buy it from him?

**A:** No. Unless he modifies the gun so it's no longer classified as an assault weapon, it will be considered an assault weapon and as such would be an illegal sale or transfer.

**Q:** Some of the guns I use take magazines that carry more than 10 rounds. What do I do with them?

**A:** Senate Bill 1446 prohibits the possession of magazines that can hold more than 10 rounds as of July 2017. That expands on an existing state law barring the sale and import of such magazines. You might need to get rid of old high-volume magazines by destroying them, selling them to licensed gun dealers or handing them in to law enforcement.
